Form I-94 Arrival/Departure Record

Background: The Form I-94 Arrival/Departure Record is a document used to record an individual's entry to and exit from the United States. The I-94 entry data is available to the traveler through the U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) website.

Those entering the U.S. from land border crossings may still receive a paper I-94 card in their passport. Some individuals may also receive admission stamps in their passports to serve as evidence of lawful admission to the U.S., though admission stamps are not always provided.

WHERE DO I GET MY I-94?

Visit the CBP <u>website</u> to access your I-94 and ensure that the class of admission was correctly entered and matches the annotation on your admission stamp (if received).

WHAT DO I NEED TO DO ABOUT THE I-94 AFTER FUTURE INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL?

Always review the relevant DIS travel webpage (J-1, O-1, H-1B) BEFORE any international travel. After your return, send DIS a copy of your electronic I-94 record and new admission stamp, if received, via the DIS Customer Portal:

Keep a copy for your records as you will need information from the electronic record to obtain a Social Security Number (SSN), apply for a driver's license, or any other situation where the I-94 information may be necessary.
