H-1B Process

STEP 1: SUBMIT REQUEST TO DIS

New appointment or renewal approved by Institute/Center (IC)



IC submits <u>New or Renewal</u>

STEP 2: IF APPLICABLE, SCIENTIST OBTAINS WAIVER OF 212(e) TWO-YEAR HOME RESIDENCE REQUIREMENT

If scientist is subject to 212(e), s/he must obtain waiver to become eligible for H-1B status. The waiver request is a personal application, so scientist independently completes this process. For more information, refer to DIS 212(e) guidance. The scientist can initiate the waiver process after receiving an offer of employment.

STEP 5: IF APPLICABLE: ENTRY INTO U.S.

If scientist is outside U.S., s/he uses Form I-797 Approval Notice to apply for H-1B entry visa at U.S. Consulate



Upon entering U.S., scientist is issued I-94 reflecting H-1B status by <u>U.S. Customs and Border Protection</u> (CBP)
